# Commitment Form Responses

(as of 7:00am - August 10, 2020)

- 1581 Responses (includes some duplicates, does not include some families that did not submit a form for each student)
- Approximately 95% of students accounted for thus far
- 38 respondents without internet access
- 25.4% of students have selected remote learning (breakdown on following slide)
- 74.6% of students have selected blended learning
  - 84.4% request morning session
  - 14.7% request afternoon session
  - 0.8% have no preference
- Transportation
  - 82.2% car riders
  - 7.4% bus
  - 29.4% walk
  - 12.5% student driver

# Scheduling Process

- RHS developing/finalizing master schedule
  - Determine maximum class sizes that when divided AM/PM, attain 14 students in class
  - Assign AM/PM based upon requests, siblings, courses, timestamps, and other factors
- RMS and RES creating/modifying master schedule
  - Determining class sizes and staffing needs
  - Assign AM/PM based upon requests, RHS schedule, courses, timestamps, and other factors
  - RMS adjusting number of specials sections to assist RHS in scheduling constraints
- RES determining remote staffing needs and teaching assignments based on remote learning selections



# RES Remote Learning Expectations

## **RES - Virtual Community Forum on August 6th**

- Engagement daily with staff members
- Combination of teacher/student interaction and independent work
- Teachers dedicated to remote instruction
- Appropriate levels of support, intervention, and enrichment
- Chromebook access provided; students work in a variety of online applications



# RES Blended Learning Expectations

## **RES - Virtual Community Forum on August 6th**

- Face to face instruction half the day
- Independent learning the opposite half of the day
- AM Session 8:20-11:20 (building opens at 8:05)
- PM Session 12:30-3:30 (building opens at 12:15)
- Lunch distribution at the end of the sessions (students eat at home or have lunch for the following day before school)
- Classes begin with morning meeting and end with closing circle
- School consists of core academic instruction, intervention/enrichment, and specials classes (art, music, PE, wellness)



# Wednesday Learning Expectations

<u>Wednesday - Remote Learning Day (All Students):</u> All students will continue their learning remotely on Wednesdays. Blended and online students will all meet virtually together.

- RES Student Schedule Example (Wednesday):
  - 8:00-8:45 Independent work activity
  - 8:45-10:15 Online classroom instruction and teacher interaction
  - 10:15-12:30 Independent work, lunch, non-academic activity
  - 12:30-2:00 Online classroom instruction and teacher interaction
  - 2:00-3:30 Independent work



# Technology Planning

- Referenced setback last week chromebook order delayed from October to possibly January
- Multiple options presented
  - Lease
  - Purchase refurbished
  - Chrome Bits/Mouse/Keyboard

\*\*All not cost effective at this time

- Bring Your Own Device is the last option
  - Requires revision of Board Policy 5136 Personal Communication Devices
  - Shift allocation of current chromebooks to K-5, remote learners, and those students 6-12 without devices
  - Decreases order placed improves general fund balance
- Broadband Ohio Connectivity Grant allocates funds to support hotspot technology
  - Placing order this week and should arrive by the start of the school year

  - Elementary drop off in various locations around the back of the building
  - RHS/RMS drop off in the front of the building
  - Temperature/symptom checks when coming into the building

  - 8:05 doors open
