



When children experience social, emotional or interpersonal difficulties, it affects their behavior and interferes with their daily lives.

Individual and family counseling services provided by Best Point Behavioral Health by the Children's Home are designed to help children attain and maintain a healthy state of mind, while also improving the functioning of the child and the family. **To make a referral, visit <https://www.tchcincy.org/page/referral> or contact your school counselor**

These services – for children of all ages – are provided on Reading Community schools K-12 site along with at their Madison Road campus, in homes, and community settings. Children's Home has Open Access Hours for our Medical Management Services on Tuesdays from 9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. This is a first-come, first-served basis, no adults and no private insurance.

They also offer a variety of services to meet the needs of all families:

Counseling: Counseling services are available to improve the functioning of the child and family.

Case Management: Our case managers provide a variety of community-based treatment services to help children function successfully.

Day Treatment: The most intensive of our mental health programs for children ages 3 to 18, this program provides a structured, therapeutic environment.

Substance Use: Our STAR program is a community-based treatment option for adolescents, ages 13-18, with co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders.

Psychiatric Services: Our team of psychiatrists, pediatricians and psychiatric nurse practitioners provide medication evaluation, review, follow-up and education.

Early Childhood Therapeutic Support: Individual and family counseling services provided by The Children's Home specifically for young children and their caregivers.
