Board Discussion

Bullying and Anti-Harassment Policy and Procedures

- Superintendent Enix provided a presentation regarding district policies and procedures
 pertaining to Harassment, Intimidation, and Bullying. Mr. Enix shared Board policy language
 regarding reporting methods and investigation procedures of reported bullying.
- One way bullying can be reported through the RCCSD district website. This allows the reporter
 to complete a bullying report through Public School Works. Reporters can choose to remain
 anonymous. Once the report is submitted a notification is automatically sent to building
 administrators and an investigation initiated.
- Families are given access to the district bullying policies a the beginning of each year when completing Final Forms. Both parents and students electronically sign off acknowledging that they have received this policy.
- Mr. Enix shared examples of some differences between bullying versus conflict. A matrix was shared with the Board used by RJSH administrators.
- A variety of tools and resources are available at the discretion of the district in the event of reported bullying or conflict. This could range from mediation, monitoring, supervision, or enforcement of the school's Code of Conduct.
- Schools are accountable to deal with conflicts and/or bullying. It's important to remember that a school day is under seven hours long and student interaction outside of school has a significant impact during the school day, especially in the age of social media.
- Parents are encouraged to be involved and monitor student use of social media to assist with issues related to cyberbullying and other inappropriate use of this communication tool. A link to a number of parent resources was provided in the district report (link below).
