Program of Studies

Mark Edwards gave a curriculum update. His presentation can be found $\underline{\text{here}}$. Three goals were detailed during the update.

Developing Cohesive Departments

Departments have been working on developing mission statements that coincide with the mission statement for the district. The purpose of this is to help drive departmental decisions regarding curriculum and course offerings.

Building a Data Culture

A district data suite has been built to help teachers access data in one place.



Developing an Engaging Curriculum

A new <u>Program of Studies</u> was introduced, highlighted by new credentialing courses in construction and manufacturing, as well as a new CCP Introduction in Education Course. A new plan to accelerate a cohort of English students was discussed as well. Finally, a new tool to help students select classes was introduced where students would match a career they are interested in with course offerings at the HS. The new Career Community Cards will help students successfully select the courses to help them transition to their next steps after graduation.

Mrs. Wernery asked if the district has study hall opportunities. Mr. Edwards advised study hall opportunities still exist but not as many opportunities to take a study hall within the new Program of Studies when following a specific path. Study Hall was removed from the Program of Studies for 7^{th} and 8^{th} grade students for 22/23 School Year.

Mrs. Thamann asked if students who start on one pathway and wish to switch to another pathway after 1-2 years how this works. Mr. Edwards advised the student is not stuck in the original pathway and are not in jeopardy to graduate on time, however the student will be not have as long on the new pathway and courses will be limited and won't experience the entire pathway of opportunities.

Mrs. Thamann voiced a need to add additional coursework for those students in the 11^{th} and 12^{th} grade who started on the Advanced pathway in 7^{th} or 8^{th} grade as the student starts to run out of coursework since it was taken earlier.

BOARD COMMITTEE UPDATES

Building & Grounds – Meeting was held prior to the board meeting at 3:00 p.m. Ms. Bemmes provided an update of the highlights of the meeting.

- Bleacher donation \$10,000 accepted already and another \$12,000 anticipated in February.
 \$22,000 will be donated specifically for bleachers and bat racks. Several donors will contribute.
 The donations cover almost all of the cost.
- The bleachers are for the baseball and softball fields at Hilltop Athletic Complex.
- Due to the timing of the baseball and softball season and the lead time needed for order and delivery of the bleachers, it was recommended a resolution was added to approve the purchase of the bleachers and bat racks.
- The district received quotes to double the size of the sidewalk and adding walkways from the sidewalk to both fields and the storage shed. This will be considered a long term project and the district will work to raise donations to help fund this project. We currently do not have any donations. In the meantime, the district will investigate adding gravel pathways from the sidewalk to both fields and the storage shed to eliminate wear and tear on the new grass.
- Scoreboards were priced and currently there is no funding to support the purchase.
- The district received in the fall of 2021 a quote to repair the property at Central for approx.
 \$85,000. Currently the Soccer teams practice in Evendale and do not have a practice space in the district. At this time, the district has not allocated any funding to repair Central.
- The district is reviewing options with the City on turfing the Football Stadium which will result in soccer space (as alternative to Central) at an increase in facility usage fee. The City is awaiting status of their NFL grant.

BOARD DISCUSSION

2023-2024 Calendar Revision

Discussion was held regarding the need to add a contractual work day missing from the 2023-24 work calendar. There was a priority when deciding the day to complete the first semester and winter exams prior to Winter Break as well as consolidating breaks for the least disruption to academics and families. The most significant change was moving the 2024 Spring Break a week earlier to the week of March 25th instead of April 1st to better align with the Ohio State Testing Schedule. Bullying Report

Dr. Davis shared the first half bullying report with the board per Ohio State Law.

Negotiations

The current certified teaching staff contract expires June 30th. Negotiations are set to begin on a new contract January 24th-26th.

Effective School Board A-Z Award

The Reading Community City School District has received the Gold award for distinction for the past 12 years. The award is given to outstanding work in meeting Board goals and is issued by the Ohio School Board Association. The self-evaluation was discussed for this year's award.

January/February Professional Development

The district engaged in professional development on January 17th. Teachers spent time learning about vape education, dyslexia training, math curriculum adoption, safety training and more.



Evans Caddie Scholarship

The district was visited by a board member of the Evan's Caddy Scholarship program this past week. The organization which gives full tuition scholarships to 22 different colleges across the nation was seeking Reading students to apply for the scholarship. In order to qualify the students must work as a golf caddy for a select number of rounds and have a strong academic performance in the classroom. District AED Devices and Replacement Cycles

The district currently has eight AED devices throughout the district and three of the devices are in need of new pads and batteries in order to pass their two year inspection. The district will be replacing the needed items. Some discussion was made around getting more devices so anyone leaving campus would be able to bring a device with them. District Nurse Niki Luken is working with Nick Wilson, the Athletic Director, to create emergency action plans and plan training. All coaches are trained on the AED device.

Mr. Perdue advised all coaching staff must have CPR training as part of the Pupil Activity Permit requirements. He recommends coaches to have access to AEDs at all times.
